Aims and Scope

The Journal of the JSTP provides the most advanced scientific and technical information on the technology of plasticity in Japan as well as promotes the international exchange of technical research. The Journal covers all aspects of modern forming technology such as sheet forming, bulk forming, powder forming and polymer forming. Articles concerning the boundary areas of the plastic forming industry are strongly encouraged.

1. Authors

The first author of the paper must be a member of the JSTP.

2. Originality

Papers submitted must be original and previously unpublished.

3. Language, Units and Length

The language of the Journal is English and the units used are SI. The maximum space available is five printed pages (allowable charged-excess: +2 pages) for a regular paper, five printed pages (allowable charged-excess: +3 pages) for a review paper, three printed pages for a note and 1/3 page for a letter including figures and tables.

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The date of receipt of the manuscript is the date of its arrival at the society's office.

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Acceptance or rejection of submitted papers will be based on and determined by the refereeing standards of the Journal's office.

6. Responsibility of Contents

The responsibility for the contents of published articles rests solely with the authors and not the society.

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A paper charge of ¥40,000 (¥25,000 for a note) will be invoiced to the author or the author's designated institution. The first author will be charged a mandatory excess-page charge of ¥40,000 per page for every page over 6 pages. Fifty reprints will be provided to the first author following publication and receipt of payment.

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Please type manuscripts using A4 size $(21 \text{ cm} \times 30 \text{ cm})$ paper. One typed page should contain 54 typed lines×2 columns per page and 52 characters per line. Page numbers must be placed on the upper right hand corner of each page.

Sample Layout:

1st page : title, names of authors, affiliation and mailing address, abstract of less than 150 words, key words 5-10 in number

2nd and following pages: text, figures, table

The text should be arranged in the following manner: Introduction, Materials and Methods, Discussions, Results, Acknowledgements, References, Nomenclature, Appendix.

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Use short paragraphs wherever possible. Express ideas clearly and avoid using jargon. Abbreviations should be explained in the text. If many abbreviations are used, a table of abbreviations should be included.
